Building update

At the moment we are putting together a landscape plan (a requirement for the building licence). We thought the front garden area would be landscaped with native flora and be waterwise. We thought xanthoreas (grasstrees) maybe a macrocarpa; a mallee eucalypt or more commonly known as a rose of the west. These are small trees about 3.5m wide and 3m tall.

Colour of the building will be sand finished render. Sandstone for the main frontage with ochre or slightly darker oxide tinted for the recessed areas. Bruce and Ariane have had a great idea using the old mural boards, cut out shapes of birds flying and placed across the face of the building.

The City has recently partnered up with the South Metropolitan Regional Council (SMRC) to deliver a Dry Cell Battery Recycling Program in the City of Cockburn!!

Commencing from September residents in Cockburn can drop off their old household batteries at any of five locations in the City:

1. Spearwood Library
2. Coolbellup Library
3. Success Library
4. Phoenix Shopping Centre
5. Cockburn Gateway Shopping Centre

The community initiative gives everyone the ability to recycle common household batteries at a range of convenient locations. The types of batteries accepted include:

1. AA and AAA cells (single use and rechargeable batteries)
2. C and D sized batteries
3. Button batteries (e.g. watches)
4. 9V batteries
5. 6V batteries (e.g. lantern, torch batteries)

Don't forget we have a collection happening at school as well. The box is located on top of our pigeon holes.
